Charging Table Switch



Many occasions the switch key was found left in the switch from the flying session before. Please remove the key from the switch when you are done, and hang it on the hook where the string is attached. DO NOT leave key in the switch or left it on.

PCC Field operation hours is from Sun up to Sun Down. If you can't see the Sun (other than Foggy/Smoky days), no flight operation is allowed.



Remember, PCC has the "NO BADGE, NO FLY" rule. You are not allowed to fly if you don't not display your current PCC badge.

If you see someone without a badge, ask to see it. Don't be shy. It is the responsibility of every member to keep the flying field safe.

Yes, you do need the stinking badge to fly at PCC! This rule is to protect our flying field. Thank you for your understanding.

SHARPS Disposal

No matter where you are:

- Sharps should never be thrown loosely into the trash or toilet.
- Sharps should never be recycled.
- Sharps that retract after use, or are very small, should be disposed of like all other sharps.



When you build model aircrafts, you produce SHARPS waste. Knife blades, pins, screws....I put all the used sharp objects in an old medicine bottle with a sealable cap. I put screws in there too because I don't want to put them into the trash cans, risking them falling out of the trash truck and ending up on the street when I drive! I take that with other hazardous waste to the San Mateo Household Hazardous Waste Center at 32 Tower Road, San Mateo, CA 94402. May be there is a collection center near where you live.

Their web site has all the information you will need to use their free services!



Another Safety Reminder

One of PCC member almost got into a head-on accident couple weeks ago. He was leaving the field to go North towards HMB. He looked and the North bound lane is clear. He then proceeds to enter Hwy 1 from our driveway. A car on the South bound lane suddenly pullout to pass the truck that was in front of him. Our member had to pull off the roadway to avoid a head-on collision!



When you leave the flying field going North towards Half Moon Bay. Don't just look to the left for on-coming traffics. PLEASE ALSO LOOK TO THE RIGHT before you get onto Highway 1! As the stretch of Highway 1 outside the PCC field is a Passing Zone, the North Bound lane could be occupied by a vehicle passing another vehicle going South, which will be in your lane!



Look twice before you enter the highway! Make sure no one is passing another car.

Also the safest way to enter the field from the North is the go down to Verde Road, make a left turn at Verde Road. Make a U-turn and come back North to the PCC Gate. Do not cut across traffics on Highway 1.
